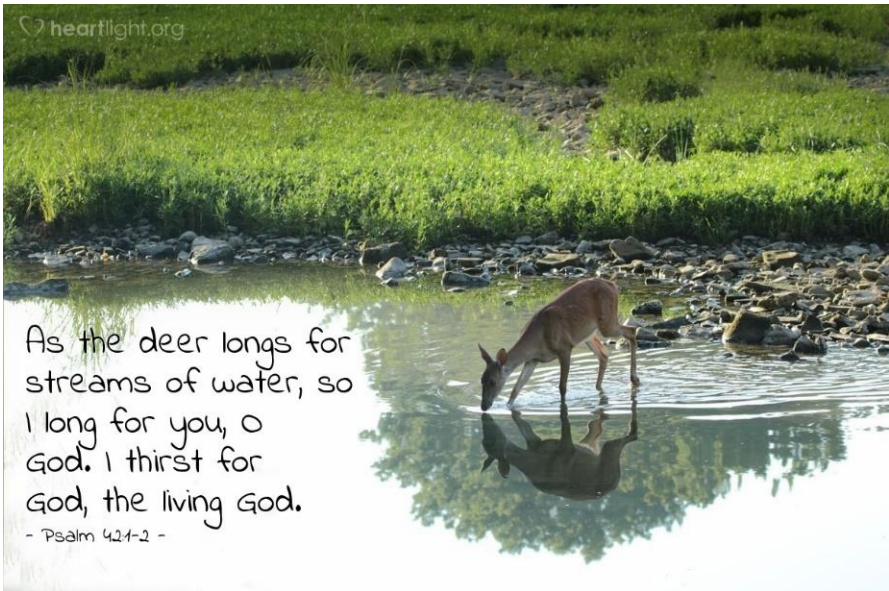

## June 16: Youth Day

On June 16, we remembered what transpired on that day in 1976 when over 500 Soweto youth were killed, ambushed by the apartheid regime police. We remember the way this atrocity and the power of the student uprising electrified youth and civic and labour movements across the country, intensifying the struggle to overcome the inequality and oppression caused by apartheid. Sadly, that struggle is not over, for social inequality is even more deeply entrenched in our society. As I write this the queue of homeless people standing in front of the soup trolley stands 48 deep. Over double the average last year. People are suffering. Suffering because of an economic system that creates a brutal class structure, suffering because of the looting of state funds, suffering because of a downgrading economy. And young people suffer the brunt of this. Let us commit to working towards a society in which young peoples' lives are treasured, cared for and filled with wonderful opportunities.
